## Colorado Senate Bill 20-163: School Entry Immunization What Does The Law Mean?

Senate Bill 20-163: School Entry Immunization aims to keep Colorado communities protected from vaccine-preventable diseases by modernizing school entry immunization requirements. The bill was signed into law by Governor Polis on June 26, 2020 and took effect during the 2021-22 school year. Supported by the <u>vast majority</u> of Colorado voters, strengthening Colorado's immunization law was a long-awaited policy solution.



#### What the law does:

# Standardizes the exemption process and implements an equal effort requirement

- Preserves the nonmedical exemption option so that parents with deeply held beliefs are not required to vaccinate
- Requires the use of a stateissued form when electing an <u>exemption</u> from school-required vaccines
- Establishes two ways to obtain a Certificate of Nonmedical
   Exemption: complete the state's Online Immunization
   Education Module or get a Colorado-licensed immunizing provider's signature on the standardized exemption form

# Creates healthier, safer schools

- Establishes a "vaccinated child standard" of 95% for all schoolrequired vaccines, where the immunization rate goal for every school is 95% of the student population to be vaccinated
- Provides additional resources and support to help schools and communities reach this goal
- Requires schools to actively notify parents of school MMR immunization and exemption rates each year

#### Ensures more accurate, efficient, and useful immunization data systems

 Requires all immunizing providers to report immunization and exemption information into the Colorado Immunization Information System (CIIS)

## What hasn't changed:

- No parent is required to vaccinate their child if they are opposed.
- Parents can remove their child's information from the Colorado Immunization Information System (CIIS).
- Immunization and/or exemption information remains confidential and private.
- Parents of students who solely participate in a nonpublic home-based education program under §22-33-104.5,
   C.R.S. and do not attend a public, private, or charter school for a portion of the day are not required to submit the state-issued standard Certificate of Nonmedical Exemption and can instead submit a signed statement of nonmedical exemption.

#### What does this mean for me if I am a:

### PARENT OR CAREGIVER

- Continue to keep your child(ren) up to date on <u>school- and child care-required</u> and <u>recommended</u>
   <u>vaccinations</u> and submit immunization information to your school or child care facility at the required
   deadlines and intervals.
- To obtain a <u>Certificate of Nonmedical Exemption</u>, you will be required to complete the Online Immunization Education Module or get a Colorado-licensed immunizing provider's signature on the state's standardized exemption form, both issued by the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE).

#### SCHOOL OR CHILD CARE CENTER

- Ensure children and students are in compliance with Colorado law (Board of Health rule <u>6 CCR 1009-2</u>)
  which requires all students attending Colorado schools and licensed child cares to be vaccinated against
  certain diseases, unless an exemption is filed.
- To meet the <u>"vaccinated child standard,"</u> perform activities to reach 95% vaccination coverage across your school or child care center.
- Send CDPHE's annual parent letter (K-12 or child care) to your school's families by February 15 of each year.
- Enroll in the Colorado Immunization Information System (CIIS).
- Stay up to date on the current law and rules by following <u>Board of Health meetings</u> and staying engaged with communications from CDPHE and Immunize Colorado.

#### **HEALTH CARE PROVIDER**

- Encourage your patients to stay up-to-date on recommended and school-required vaccines.
- Continue to train staff on helpful strategies for communicating with parents about the benefits of vaccination.
- <u>Enroll</u> in the Colorado Immunization Information System (CIIS). Continue to input patient immunization and exemption data into CIIS to maintain a clear picture of community protection against vaccine-preventable diseases for public health response.
- Stay up to date on the current law and rules by following <u>Board of Health meetings</u> and staying engaged with communications from CDPHE and Immunize Colorado.
